COURSE DESCRIPTION: Continued practice in drawing the clothed figure with greater expectation of sophistication regarding media and illustration style, and stressing larger more complex finished drawings. Prerequisite: IL340.

COURSE OBJECTIVES: As a result of completing this course successfully, you should be able to:
Draw the clothed figure showing how the underlying form effects the drapery and how the drapery describes the forms

TOPICAL OUTLINE:

- Class 1: Introductory lecture discussing objectives, materials, and expectations. Introductory drawings.
- Class 2-3: 20, 40, and 120 minute poses. Studies of the draped figure.
- Class 4-5: 120 minute poses. Variety of media, in illustration styles.
- Class 6-15: 5 hour poses. Student choice of style and media.

ACADEMIC EXPECTATIONS:

Grading: Your grade in the course will consist of the following:

Portfolio	70%
Class participation	15%
Attendance	15%

80% of the course must be completed in order to receive a passing grade.

Portfolio grade: The grade will be based upon how well you draw the draped figure.

2. expression, feeling and action
3. creation of form
4. following class assignments

Class participation grade:

Students are expected to participate in all aspects of the course. Use of time, personal motivation, attitude, effort.

Make-up: Any class time lost through missed attendance can be made up by sitting in on another life class with the permission of the instructor.
